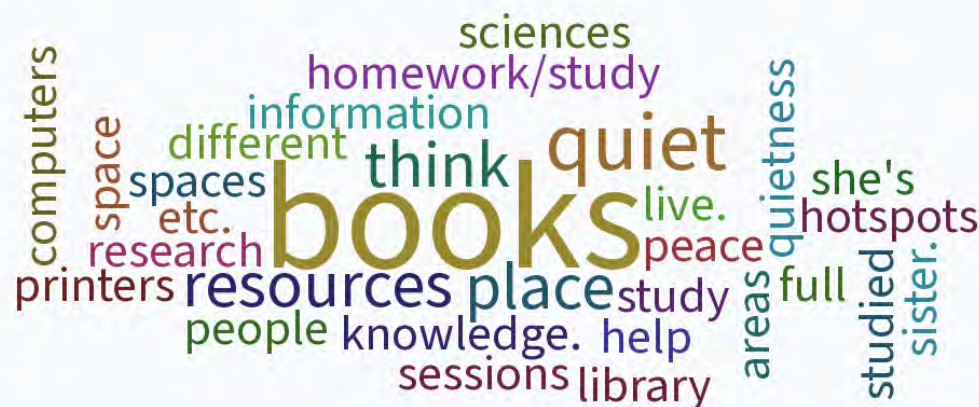

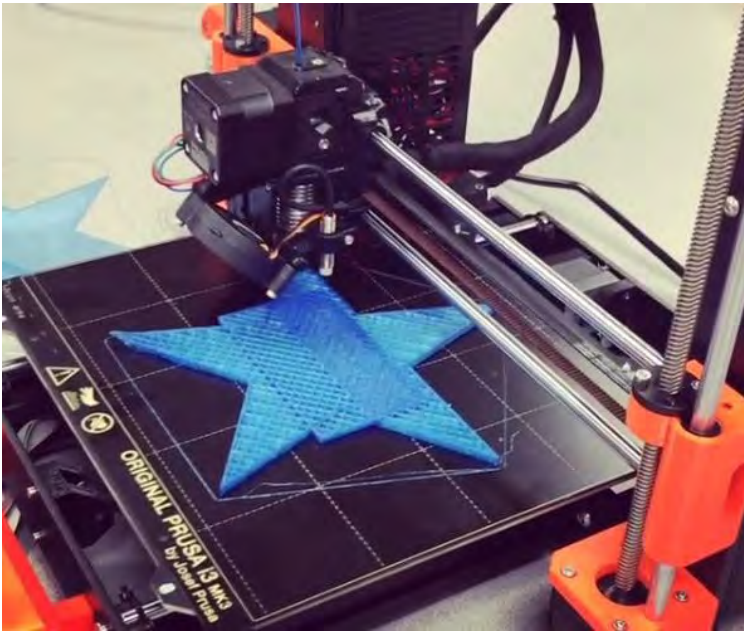

Library Collections

- Physical collection
 - Books
 - Some academic journals, magazines, newspapers, videos, etc.
 - Special Collections
- Online Collection
 - Databases with thousands of eBooks, academic journals, magazines, newspapers, videos, etc.
- Everything can be searched online



Any publication that comes out periodically, including journals, magazines, and newspapers.



ACADEMIC JOURNAL

A periodical aimed at scholars, academics, and researchers, usually written in technical language by experts on the subject. A few examples are *Journal of Advanced Nursing*, *Shakespeare Quarterly*, and *Nature*.

MAGAZINE

A periodical aimed at a specific audience, covering recent issues and specific subjects through articles, interviews, and personal narratives. Some examples are *National Geographic*, *Time*, and *Popular Mechanics*.



NEWSPAPER

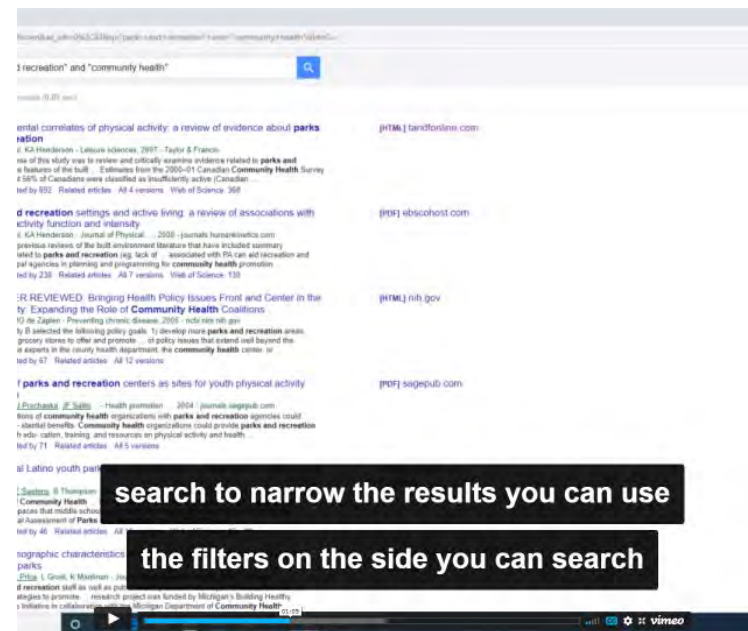
A periodical aimed at the general public, covering recent issues and news in a formal, brief, and objective matter. A few examples are *New York Times*, *Wallstreet Journal*, and *The Commercial Appeal*.

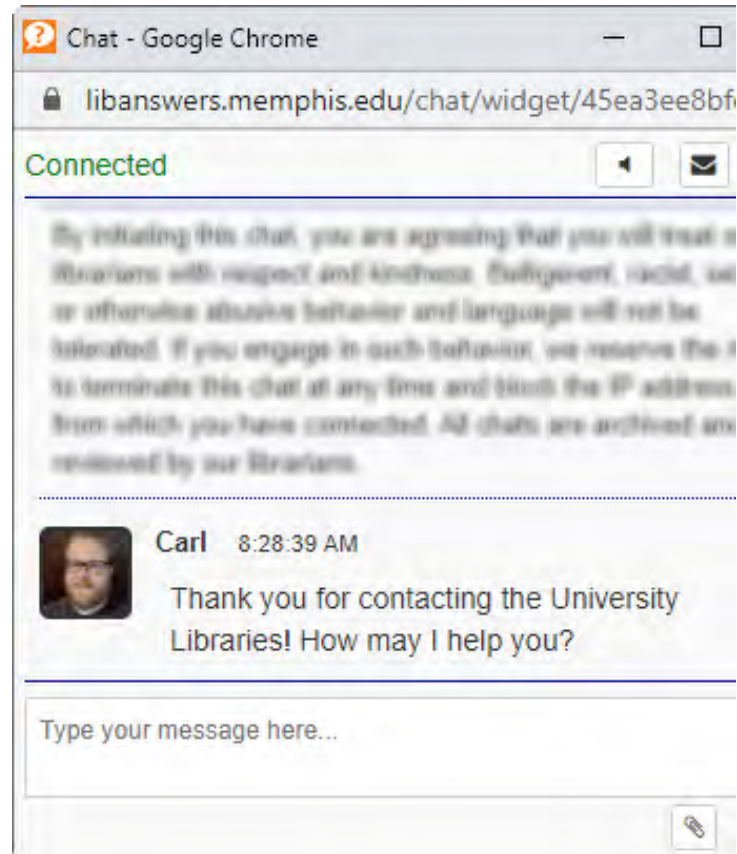


