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Reading With Purpose



Preview headings, summaries, and key terms.



Take notes, highlight, and ask questions as you read.



SQ3R Method: Survey, Question, Read, Recite, Review



Challenge yourself to summarize sections!





Organize Ideas Effectively

- Read and follow the instructions carefully!
- Start by outlining and planning before you write.
- These-Driven: Make a clear argument and support it.
- Introduction: Introduce the topic, provide context, and state your argument in your thesis
- Body: Support your thesis with relevant and appropriate sources
- Conclusion: Reinforce key ideas, bring closure to the audience





Source Selection



Use credible sources: Academic journals, databases, and books.



Note relevant information as you go.



When in doubt, credit the author to avoid plagiarism.



Learn citation formats and visit WCS!



Sample papers can provide good examples.
