

Securing internal and then transitioning to external funding with help from CCFA and the Division of Research and Innovation

Overview

This document provides a set of instructions specific to integrating CCFA and DRI resources to support CCFA faculty in their pursuits of both internal university funding from DRI and support from external funders. Two sets of instructions are provided: one for teams and one for individuals.

Teams

Develop or join a CCFA-led community of interest

We can help you with this. Here's how:

- CCFA has developed a networking tool: The "Collaboration Tool: Topic-Discipline Matrices" is an interactive tool for identifying areas of common interest among CCFA faculty, campus partners, and community members, available at <https://www.memphis.edu/ccfa/resources/resources-faculty.php>. Work with CCFA to get your community/team internally funded

DRI sponsors the Community of Research Scholars (CoRS) grants. Amounts are \$2,500 for round 1 (project period of one-two years) and \$5,000 for round 2 (project period of one-two years). Total funding is \$7,500.

We will help your team secure CoRS funding. Here's how:

- CCFA has an extensive network of campus and community partners who can help your teams fill gaps in expertise and resources.

of an application submitted to an external funder is already required for round 2 eligibility.

Work with CCFA to get your project internally funded

DRI also funds the Fine Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences Support Program. Awards include the Professional Indexing Grant, Image Reproduction Fund, Subvention Grant, and Field Work & Archival Grant. The award amount is \$2,500. Application details are posted to InfoReady.
