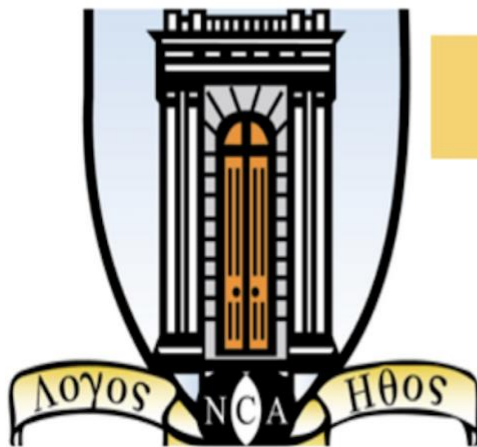


NCA DeadlineReminder
