STEP 1

Go to **memphis.edu/portal/graduate_application** to begin your graduate school application process. The minimum GPA requirement for master's applicants is 2.75, 3.00 for doctoral applicants.

STEP 2

A non-refundable application and processing fee of \$35.00 is required of every domestic applicant, \$60.00 for international applicants.

STEP 3

After receiving and reviewing your application and all required documentation, your program will make a decision. After the department has determined your admissibility, the decision will be communicated to the Office of Graduate Admissions. You will receive notification of the decision directly from the Office of Graduate Admissions.

*Note: Many of the programs in the College of Education include an interview as part of their application process. After conducting your interview and reviewing your application and all required documentation, your program will make a decision.
