By the end of their first semester of study, students are expected to pass:

- ✓ a slide exam on ancient Egyptian art
- ✓ a competency exam in Middle Egyptian hieroglyphs
- ✓ a competency exam in either German or French translation

## These exams are required for advancement to degree candidacy.

By the end of the first year, students are expected to have selected a thesis committee

By the end of the second year students are expected to have:

- ✓ Successfully completed a master's thesis
- ✓ Passed a comprehensive examination (administered after submission of the M.A. thesis to the student's committee).
- ✓ Successfully defended the comprehensive exam and the M.A. thesis.

<sup>1</sup> Roman Art or Art and Archaeology of Pompeii may only be substituted for Greek Art if Greek Art is not offered during the academic year. At the approval of the concentration advisor, students who have had Classical art as part of their undergraduate degree programs may be granted an exemption from Greek Art.
