COURSES TAUGHT

ENGL 1010: English Composition I

This course is the first in the First Year Writing sequence, focusing on the writing process and primarily personal/narrative writing. The course scaffolds discussions, pre-writing activities, and peer review, culminating in a final Writer's Portfolio. *also taught in 7-week half sessions*

ENGL 1020: English Composition II

This course is the second in the First Year Writing sequence. This course focuses on academic research and rhetorical analysis, with an emphasis on the students' local community. *also taught in 7-week half sessions and 5-week summer sessions*

ENGL 3601: Intro to Technical and Professional Communication

This course gives students the opportunity to learn and apply principles of technical writing and rhetoric to communication in the workplace, focusing on document design principles, accessibility, professional workplace communication, and collaborative online writing.

ENGL 4/6619: Web & Online Writing

This course focuses on digital literacy, data and personal privacy online, collaborative online writing, social media writing, web content writing, algorithms, web design basics, and web accessibility/universal design.
