NEW MEDIA PLAYER


The new media player design in Canvas includes a flatter design, increased default size, updated closed captioning icon, keyboard accessibility, and privacy measures. The media player playback experience has been improved with enhanced accessibility, adaptive streaming, and privacy features.

- The default embed size is increased to 480x300px.
- The play bar is redesigned and repositioned.
- An open-source media player is integrated to align with the Canvas design pattern.
- The Closed Caption icon is updated.
- Keyboard accessibility is improved with the addition of a hidden shortcut icon.
- Privacy measures are enhanced to ensure secure playback.
- Video quality automatically adjusts based on available bandwidth.
- Note: This feature will be available in the beta environment on 2025-04-19.
- The Media Player now has the ability to upload and delete closed captions.

This update provides better usability, accessibility, and integration, offering a more intuitive design, improved navigation, and greater compatibility with Canvas. These updates streamline the user experience while maintaining familiarity and long-term support.



NEW QUIZZES - ENHANCED QUIZ ACTIVITY LOG DETAILS (INSTRUCTORS)

In the Activity Log, instructors can view the Client IP Address and Browser Session ID for each question of a quiz. This update provides instructors with greater visibility into quiz activity, helping them verify student engagement and identify potential irregularities during quiz attempts. In the Activity Log, instructors can view additional information related to each question.

ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY UPDATE

The university is updating its Acceptable Use Policy to strengthen data security across all university-owned equipment. A key revision emphasizes that personal software installed on university devices must not store restricted data.

Faculty and staff were reminded that safeguarding university data is a shared responsibility. Users are personally accountable for ensuring the security of any data accessed or stored on their devices—even when using non-university software.

This policy update underscores the importance of responsible technology use to prevent potential data breaches and protect sensitive university information. Stay tuned for further updates as the revised policy is finalized.

IMPORTANT UPDATE: COURSE EMAIL GROUPS TO BE DISCONTINUED

Beginning with the Summer 2025 semester, course email groups—such as those named by course number, section, and term (e.g., PSYC1030001.2023F@ memphis.edu)—will no longer be available due to changes in Microsoft's Office 365 service.

Microsoft is phasing out support for these group email functions, which means they can no longer be used to send messages to entire classes. Faculty who currently rely on course email groups for class communication are encouraged to explore alternative tools such as Microsoft Teams or Canvas messaging. QUESTIONS/SUGGESTIONS/ISSUES

Members of TLAC recently inquired about options for managing current courses more efficiently in Canvas. In response, courses are now configured so that the most recent two years are prioritized on the Canvas dashboard. This update is designed to help faculty quickly locate and manage active and recent classes, streamlining course administration.
