

THE LATEST IN CANVAS UPDATES

Welcome back! Accessibility and usability users can now enable a "Dyslexia Friendly Font" in settings to switch Canvas and the Rich Content Editor (RCE) to OpenDyslexic for improved readability. The RCE also defaults image dimensions to percentages and includes plus/minus icons for quick resizing. DocViewer now supports touch and stylus input on ChromeOS devices for easier annotations, and each discussion reply includes a copyable permalink for direct sharing.

NEW QUIZZES: ENHANCEMENTS FOR INSTRUCTORS

Text Blocks: You can now add standalone text blocks to New Quizzes. These are useful for providing instructions or additional context that isn't tied to a specific question.

Enhanced Moderation Tools: The Moderation page has been updated to make it easier to manage accommodations. Instructors can now add time to an active quiz attempt and will see a more user-friendly interface.

Enhanced Quiz Logs: Instructors and admins can now view the Client IP address for each quiz question in the Activity Log, offering greater visibility into guiz activity.

Detect Multiple Sessions: A new quiz setting allows instructors to monitor if students are accessing a quiz from multiple devices or browsers. If detected, students are notified, and the activity is logged, helping to ensure fair and secure testing.

NEW QUIZZES TRANSITION

The University of Memphis is transitioning all Canvas quizzes from the Classic Quizzes engine to the New Quizzes engine. By Spring 2026, all quizzes will be created using the new system. This transition will occur in phases, starting with the automatic conversion of Classic Quizzes to New Quizzes during the course copy process starting in Summer 2025 and forward. This fall will be the last semester during which Classic Quizzes can be created, as the university plans to reduce their usage to below 10%. The goal is to make New Quizzes the default quiz engine by January 2026.

YOUTUBE MEETS CANVAS



SEPTEMBER 2025 REVIEW

Canvas has teamed up with YouTube to bring its Player for Education feature directly into Studio. This integration allows YouTube Player for Education feature videos in Canvas Studio to stream without distractions, recommendations, or links back to YouTube. Viewers remain anonymous to YouTube through a "signed out" viewing state with captioning from YouTube to maintain accessibility. This means you will be able to use Canvas Studio to safely and confidently incorporate YouTube content into your instruction without exposing students to commercial distractions or compromising institutional data privacy standards. To take full advantage of the Player for Education, you must add YouTube videos to Canvas Studio. Clients will be able to feature any existing or new YouTube videos added to Canvas that will play without ads beginning September 22, 2025. Need help adding your YouTube videos to Studio? Here is a step-by-step guide.

Shundra invited participants to volunteer as meeting chair for future sessions and encouraged feedback and sharing of experiences with IT services. Chair recruitment and responsibilities include starting meetings and overseeing subcommittees if needed. All committee members were asked to email if interested.

REQUIRED ITS SECURITY AWARENESS TRAINING

Jarrod Taylor, ITS Security Communications
Compliance Coordinator shared updates
on this year's mandatory IT security
awareness training, which now includes four required
modules: security awareness, data privacy, securely
working from home, and IT policy acknowledgment.
The training takes 15–30 minutes, depending on prior
completion. Access is provided through email links and
the IT security webpage, with weekly reminders until
the deadline and daily reminders afterward. Failure to
complete on time results in restricted account access.

Student employees, including graduate assistants, must also complete the training if notified by email, based on HR job codes. In addition, phishing simulations will continue, and anyone clicking three simulated phishing emails within 12 months will be assigned a short, focused training.

Jarrod also recommended best practices such as limiting unfamiliar link sharing, using OneDrive for attachments, and posting third-party links on university web pages. He noted that accidental malicious uploads from students are unlikely but encouraged promoting caution and offering training resources. Meeting participants are asked to share these updates with colleagues and emphasize timely completion.

WINDOWS 10 TO 11 UPDATES

Michelle Belton, Director of Desktop Support Services shared updates on the university's transition from Windows 10 to Windows 11, noting Microsoft will end support for Windows 10 on October 14. Over 90% of campus devices have been upgraded, with fewer than 600 remaining; most will be updated, while others will be retired or replaced. Students on unsupported devices may face limited access to some services but can still use the internet, Canvas, lab computers, and virtual desktops. Remote faculty can coordinate upgrades through their Local Support Providers (LSPs), and all faculty and staff still using Windows 10 are urged to contact their LSP as soon as possible to schedule their upgrade.
